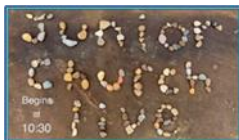

The ROCK Drop in Centre: the Vision

The Elders, Paul and Sheena say:

The ROCK Drop in Centre is a vision to use our Church Hall and refurbished kitchen in a new way:

a way that builds up our Ebenezer family;

a way that offers friendship, fellowship and support to our surrounding community, as we all emerge from the impact of the Pandemic, on our physical, mental, emotional and spiritual lives;

a place where all are welcome.

In the first instance we would offer a place where people from Ebenezer and our surrounding community can just call in for a drink, simple refreshments and a chat: our hope is that we begin to discern how we can best help individuals.

For some it may be just a listening ear and a friendly welcome, but as time goes on, we hope to be able to offer a range of support skills that members at Ebenezer have. We also have Prayer Teams who could journey with those in need.

Some time ago we heard of the work of Renew Wellbeing and a small group of people have continued to meet and pray for the way in which this could be developed. We now believe that Renew Wellbeing could be part of the ROCK Drop in too. (www.renewwellbeing.org.uk)

We continue to pray that if this is God's plan for Ebenezer, starting off in a small way will enable us to discern how we can develop this and allow other new ways of doing things to happen.

To accomplish this vision, we would need help and commitment. Some roles would be on site, some would be as and when needed.

Let's commit individually to pray and ask the Lord how He might be wanting to use us at this time.

Could you be a Prayer Backer, a Leaflet Distributor, a member of the Kitchen Team, a Befriender or a Listener?

Could you be a Driver who is willing to pick up people from our Ebenezer family who would benefit from a lift?

We would need Helpers to set up and to tidy up in the hall and outside, weather permitting.

We can already offer our new RockOfHelpLine, FAMILYLights and other Church based opportunities. Our hopes and prayers are that as we meet together, we will have opportunities to share our faith journeys, when the time is right, and point people to Jesus and His love for them.

Missions Focus on: Faith In Scarborough Schools: FISS

Missions Coordinator says:



The History of FISS

'Daily collective worship, of a broadly Christian character, should be provided by schools to promote children's spiritual, moral and cultural development.' 1988 Education Reform Act. This is the window of opportunity that was taken by Churches Together in Scarborough to set up **Faith in Scarborough Schools** (aka FISS) in 1998. Bruce Clark was charged with the responsibility of starting and running FISS, initially just two days a week. Thanks to the generosity of local Christians and churches, Bruce was soon employed full time and headed up FISS for around twenty years. He made a lasting impression on many children and young people in and around Scarborough. Bruce was supported by a loyal band of volunteers, running clubs and assemblies in schools.

Catherine Duffton took over from Bruce in September 2018 when he retired and Christina Bramley joined her in September, 2019. FISS continues to appreciate the assistance of its loyal volunteers.

FISS Commission

Faith in Scarborough Schools' commission is to serve and support schools, to help pupils consider, value and respect their own and others' beliefs, and to explore a living, Christian faith. FISS serves schools in a way that reflects the Christian faith and commitment to God.

FISS works out this commission in a way that offers the hope of God's love to *all* whom the workers meet and serve, by being rooted in God's word and grace, and working with kindness and humility.

In Primary Schools

FISS offers Assemblies to all schools, mainly online at the moment. FISS also runs clubs, workshops, events and offers Transition Mentoring (supporting children as they transfer from primary to secondary education). This is run in conjunction with the Sidewalk charity. You can watch some recent assemblies on the website, on the Primary Schools page.

In Secondary Schools

Mentoring continues into September as students transfer to their secondary schools. Please pray (and consider giving) for the resources needed for FISS to be able to offer Christian Unions to secondary schools.
