## The Advent Wreath and Candles



Advent is a season of expectation and preparation, as the Church prepares to celebrate the coming (Latin: *adventus*) of Christ in his incarnation, and also looks ahead to his final advent as judge at the end of time.

The Advent Wreath has four red or blue candles in a ring around a white or gold candle. Alternatively, there

may be three purple candles, reflecting the liturgical colour for Advent, with a pink candle for the Third Sunday, when rosepink vestments are traditionally worn. The first candle is lit on Advent Sunday; additional ones are lit, one on each Sunday, and the white or gold one on Christmas Day.
